PASTOR'S CORNER:

Acts 10:39-43

"We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

A couple of weeks ago, we had a conversation in Sunday worship about the Samaritan woman at the well. We recalled the excitement and passion she had to share the Good News with her city that the Messiah had come. In light of her passion, we discussed what it means for *us* to share the Gospel, the Good News, with the world. Like the Samaritan woman, we are excited to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, but we must also remember that our context demands examination.

If we think of Church history like a continuation of the book of Acts, we can see that God helps His church to respond greatly to the needs of the world as they exist in that specific time period. In 2017, we would do well to know our culture and ask God how we might be creative in our response.

We live in a country where the majority of citizens know Jesus (or at the very least know *about* Jesus). Yet still, church attendance across our nation is declining rapidly. The main reason is because people are losing hope – again, not in Christ, but in the Church. Similar to the Samaritan woman at the well, and all of those who have been personal witnesses to the Messiah, we need to get excited about sharing the Good News with people. But in the 2017th "Act" in the span of the Gospel story, the Good News that we must share is not just about Jesus, but specifically about the bridegroom of Christ.

"ACT 2017"

How wonderful it would be to proclaim with confidence to the world, "Our Church is now fulfilling its true purpose in the world and is carrying out God's mission in the most powerful way! Our church is working to bring Good News to the poor, working to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, and we're working to let the oppressed go free!" Some have lost hope in that kind of church, because, to be blunt with you, churches aren't really about the work of Christ in that sense. Instead, churches have become a safe haven for people who look, act and think the same.

Excitement about participating in the Body of Christ, if we are indeed witnesses of Christ, will be at the forefront of our Good News. People are hungry and thirsty for Christ's Church to finally carry out the mission that Jesus calls us to. People are thirsty for churches that are using language that is inclusive and loving and are showing the world that they are open to diversity...and open to adding new people who may even change the dynamics of the way that particular local church functions. If we are to share the Gospel with anybody, it is that *our church is that kind of church*! And then we have to live into that proclamation.

The world looks different now. It's scary, I know. But God has a response. And I promise you, that response has nothing to do with tuning the world out and pretending it doesn't exist. Christ's followers are called to be witnesses of His glory, not just in word, but in deed.

Well, fellow witnesses, let's testify to the world the exciting work we're doing together!

Amazing Grace! How Sweet the Sound

(Children's Choir Hymn for the month of March)

One of the most popular and beloved of all hymns, *Amazing Grace*, was penned by John Newton of England in the 1700s. The hymn relates the pilgrimage of its author, who was radically transformed by the grace of God.

John Newton's devout mother dedicated him early to the ministry and began his religious training at an early age. He could recite the catechism and hymns by the age of four. His mother died when he was seven, and at the age of eleven, after several years of school away from home, he went to sea with his sea captain father. Later he served in the British Navy, deserted, and when caught was put in irons and whipped in public.

Then Newton abandoned the religious principles taught by his mother and embarked on a life of such debauchery that his friends despaired of his sanity. He signed on a slave ship and soon was master of his own ship, dealing in the monstrous evil of bringing slaves from Africa. With a whip in one hand and a gun in the other, often given to drunkenness, he sank into the deepest depths of sin.

In 1748, at the age of twenty-three, he ran into a savage storm that threatened to carry him and his ship to the bottom of the sea. Newton thought of himself, like Jonah, as the cause of the mountainous waves and raging wind that threatened to engulf the boat and its passengers. This close brush with death set him thinking about the true meaning of life and led him to read at sea Thomas a Kempis' classic, *Imitation of Christ*.


The Holy Spirit used the storm and the book to convict him of his need of Christ. Sick of his pitiable condition and of the filthy slave business, he was led to leave the slave trade and ultimately to go into the ministry. All through his life, John Newton never ceased to marvel at the grace of God that transformed him so completely. While pastoring his church in the town of Olney, he wrote his spiritual autobiography in a song that God gave him from the dark night of his soul.

Most people who sing his words about God's grace "That saved a wretch like me" do not feel that they have been "wretches." But that is exactly what John Newton realized he was when Christ saved him. Wherever he went to preach, large crowds gathered to hear the "Old converted sea captain." He declared, "Had you known that my conduct, principles and heart were still darker than my outward condition—how little would you have imagined that such a one was reserved to be such an instance of the providential care and exuberant goodness of God." His testimony has resonated around the world in his beloved hymn *Amazing Grace! How Sweet the Sound*.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Kindness Matters

My family and I had the privilege of joining your church in worship today (Sunday, March 26, 2017). I have since been compelled to share with you my experience.

Let me begin with how we came to visit this Sunday. I was first introduced to Ryan by my pastor, Dr. Danny Russell, last year at the CBF convention. We hit it off right away and became friends. I have wanted to visit and hear Ryan preach for some time. However, it has been tough to work out with my duties as a deacon and Sunday school teacher at Chadbourn Baptist Church. With respect to my pastor, I had a conversation about my intentions to visit your church and received his blessing.

I had the honor a few years ago, to give my testimony in front of my church. In that testimony, I talked about some of the reasons that I had not attended any church for a period in my life. First and foremost was that I was afraid that I would not be welcomed. I was afraid when I walked in, that every head would turn and look at me as if to say, "What is he doing in MY CHURCH!" I am not sure how many people came to us and shook our hands, and said, "Hey," to the boys, but it sure seemed like the whole church. We were blown away by the wonderful gift of bread. Then came the worship service. Oh, my, what wonderful music! The choir was incredible! Truly, I could feel the presence of God as they sang. The children's service was great.

My sister and brother-in-law with their three small kids joined today as well. The kids blended right in just as if they had been there forever. Then the sermon...Your Pastor, my friend Ryan, did not disappoint. He delivered God's message and it was awesome!!!

So what is the point of this letter? I am not really sure to be honest. However, I have been compelled to share my experience. How can I sum up my visit? I experienced Christ today at First Baptist Church! I will always treasure today and I thank everyone at First Baptist for such a wonderful day of worship.
