DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know where Sunday School originated? Most of us have probably attended Sunday School most of our lives and just assumed it was established the same time as all things church-ey.



This brings up an interesting discussion. In the latter half of the 18th century, a newspaper owner, Robert Raikes, sought to "do his father proud" with the newspaper the two had worked on together until his father's death in 1757. He walked along the streets of Gloucester, England on an errand one day and came upon a group of young fellows in a scuffle. The boys were ragged and dirty. Robert separated the two that were fighting and sent the whole crowd of young folks home. When he arrived at his designated stop, he asked the lady about the boys and their situation. She told him to pay no mind to those children and that they were referred to as the "white slaves of England" because they worked 12+ hour days in the mills and sweatshops, 6 days a week. The children "ran the roads like wild animals" on Sundays because it was their only day off. They were uneducated because they had to work to live - there was no time or extra money for formal education. Many of their parents were dead or in prison. Robert thought of his own father, "What if my father had died when I was young?"

Robert, who frequently visited the prisons of Gloucester, knew the outlook for these children was grim. They worked all the time and had no hope of an education. It was from his burden for these young people that the idea of Sunday School was born. He shared his idea with his friend, Rev. Thomas Stock. He wanted to teach the children to read and write for part of the day and teach them Bible for the rest of the day on Sundays.

It wasn't long until the idea caught on and people were noticing the behavior of these children was improving. The children had something to look forward to – something to work for. Robert was using his printing business to print reading books, spelling books, Bible study books, and scriptures for the Sunday Schools. His father would have been proud!

The first national American Sunday School effort began in 1824. It expanded to all ages and became an important outreach arm for the church.

Of course, we realize Sunday School has changed quite a bit over the years. Free public education has taken over teaching children to read and write and religious education has been left to the home and church, but Sunday School is still an important arm of the ministry of the church, today.
