# PASTOR'S CORNER: "THE BREAD OF LIFE"



This month in worship we will be taking a dive into chapter 6 of John. Throughout the chapter, Jesus continues to remind his followers that he is the bread of life that has been sent from Heaven to grant eternal life to all who would eat his body (flesh) and drink his blood. Much

like the manna that their ancestors had eaten, he was sent from Heaven. Yet those who eat of his flesh will not die, as their ancestors did.

If there's anything to be said about eating flesh, (and I recognize that this is an extreme understatement), is that doing so is *hard work*. As Christians today, perhaps we should really take that to heart. It's not some "little cracker" that we're eating when we partake in the Lord's Supper. What we're doing represents *munching* on the flesh of Jesus.

When we think of it that way, perhaps we get a better understanding of the way we approach our relationship to him in everyday life. Too often we look at Christianity as the thing that helps us to know "Right" from "Wrong." We draw lines in the sand and we tend to lean on history to teach us what that is. We are done debating; we are done dialoguing; the other side is just **wrong**. My news media supports my belief. The Bible supports my belief. My faith supports my belief. I am right and they are wrong. I am good and they are evil. Or maybe "they" are just not smart enough to know what I know.

Jesus tells us to munch on his flesh. The disciples that left when he gave those instructions recognized something – following Jesus isn't easy! Eating in the bread of life is about seeking justice, not power. Eating the bread of life is focusing on things that are eternal, not material wealth, not status. Eating the flesh of Jesus gives us reason to pause. It causes us to come to the table with even those who we don't like. To look at every human as a person created by God – and to show love.

Please, please, please, don't justify your "stance" as the bread of life, and condemn the world with your views. Please, please, please, do not perpetuate the divide in this world. Choose the true bread of life. Choose love.
