PASTOR'S CORNER



As we approach Thanksgiving, 2020, we in America and throughout the world certainly have experienced much more than we ever realized or even thought we would face since last Thanksgiving in 2019, haven't we? Because of COVID-19, we have been separated . . . have worn masks . . . have used more hand sanitizer than perhaps we ever dreamed of using . . . have tried to keep six feet apart in order to follow social distancing regulations . . . have tried to obey the government's protocol in dealing with the Pandemic . . . and we have had more people to die world-wide than we ever could have imagined! We also were privileged, during this very stressful and emotional period of our nation's history, to exercise our "right to vote" as American citizens! We are called in God's Word (I Timothy 2:1-4) to pray for those who are in authority over us. So . . . whether the "party" of your choice, or the candidates you preferred won or not, let's please commit to pray for ALL who

were elected that they may KNOW and DO God's will FULLY as they serve our country. THANK YOU for following that mandate!

We, as a church family and as individuals, have sympathized with families who have grieved and we have prayed and communicated with many others through texts, phone calls, or emails who have faced the stark reality of this dreaded "plague" that invaded our nation and our world. Joy and I personally experienced a visit from this "unwelcome guest" named CORONAVIRUS! My case with a low-grade fever, stuffy nose, and congestion was almost like an aggravating common cold with very mild symptoms compared to those Joy experienced. She was hospitalized overnight with pneumonia in both of her lungs and then was released the very next day, because "her numbers looked good and were within the margins." I felt she had been discharged TOO SOON! After I brought Joy home from the hospital, she began showing obvious signs of decline, and then she had to be re-admitted to the hospital for a week. Joy literally walked "through the valley of the shadow of death" and we could not visit her, or talk with her on the telephone. I was quarantined at home, but our daughters, Meri Beth and Molly and I became "masters" at text messaging with each other and with Joy while she was hospitalized. We are VERY THANKFUL to God and to Joy's Medical Team for their help and we are MOST GRATEFUL to say she is home now and IS progressing.

THANK YOU, one and all, for your love, thoughts, prayers, texts, emails, phone calls, cards, notes, and concern expressed for us personally—as well as for ALL others who have experienced this unique illness. I have heard that each person is affected by this sickness in very different ways—and we surely found that to be true with us in our cases! I really am grateful to our church staff (Eddie, Patricia, Teresa, and Dinah) for their commitment and continued faithful dedication to their responsibilities and ministries; for Dr. Fred Senter, who preached so well in my absence; to our deacons and their chair-person, Lauren Cole, who kept in constant communication with us; and to everyone who served in any way at all as they carried on their faithful work and service through the First Baptist Church of Whiteville. I missed you all and I appreciate your understanding, compassion, prayers and patience! I was very grateful to be able to return on Sunday, November 15, as we worshipped together and as we were blessed with the privilege of celebrating in the Ordination Service for our three (3) new deacons: Genie Carter, Peggy Underwood, and Ron Walters. CONGRATULATIONS to you new deacons! May God continue to guide and bless you all as you serve with your fellow deacons . . . and the church membership as a whole!

Last year, in 2019, before I was blessed to meet all of you in Whiteville, Joy and I, our older daughter, Meri Beth, along with two of our grandchildren, Mazi Grace and Bronson Howard, were invited and honored to be involved in a movie filmed in Loris and the Grand Strand area. It is a feature-length movie that is wholesome, family friendly and is appropriate for ALL ages. This film, A CAROLINA CHRISTMAS, was directed and produced by a friend of ours, Jerry Dalton, founder of DALTON PICTURES, based in Myrtle Beach.
