PASTOR'S CORNER



We have enjoyed a very busy and productive autumn at First Baptist Church of Whiteville and now we have celebrated Thanksgiving together . . . decorated our sanctuary beautifully as we shared the "Hanging of the Greens" in our Morning Worship Service . . . and we look forward to all the special and meaningful opportunities for worship, praise, and activities together surrounding the December holidays! I hope and pray you had a very "Happy Thanksgiving" and truly will be blessed with a "Merry Christmas" as we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the Promised Messiah—the Savior of the world!

We acknowledged with emphasis in our sermons in November the blessed privilege we have of CELEBRATING OUR DIFFERENCES! We also affirmed that we are "brothers and sisters in Christ," united together because of our love for—and devotion to—Jesus. You may have heard me quote at various times, a statement by Geoffrey F. Fisher that I have often used at weddings when encouraging the bride and groom: The ever-living Christ is here to bless you. The nearer you each stay to Him, the nearer you will stay to each other! In the Body of Christ, His Church, this statement also is true . . . and it definitely can apply to all of us! The closer we each stay to Jesus, the closer we will stay to each other! As we enter this special season of "gift-giving," as we intentionally and un-selfishly think of others, may we draw close to Jesus and share His love not only in our deeds, but also in our words and actions. As part of the sermon on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, I shared **A Short Course in Human Relations** which included the following:

The six most important words: *I admit that I was wrong.*The five most important words: *You did a great job.*The four most important words: *What do you think?*The three most important words: *Could you please...*The two most important words: *Thank you.*The most important word: *We.*The least important word: *I.*

Those two words, "we and I" truly are powerful! And . . . also very powerful is one of my favorite writings of all time which I would like to share with you as a "Christmas gift" . . . here and now! I sincerely hope and pray this writing, attributed to a pastor, Dr. James Allan Francis, will bless you as it always does me . . . and that you will have a very meaningful and spirit-filled "Merry . . . Happy . . . and Blessed Christmas" . . . celebrating Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, the Messiah of the world!

ONE SOLITARY LIFE

He was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant. He grew up in another village, where he worked in a carpenter shop util he was 30. Then, for three years, he was an itinerant preacher. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family or owned a home. He didn't go to college. He never lived in a big city. He never traveled 200 miles from the place where he was born. He did none of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but himself. He was only 33 when the tide of public opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied him. He was turned over to his enemies and went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for his garments, the only property he had on earth. When he was dead, he was laid in a borrowed grave, through the pity of a friend. Twenty-one centuries have come and gone, and today he is the central figure of the human race. All the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned—put together—have not affected the life of man on this earth as much as that ONE SOLITARY LIFE!

As Tiny Tim says in Charles Dickens' beloved <u>A Christmas Carol</u>, **God bless us everyone!** Joy and all our family join me . . . gratefully and prayerfully, in Jesus' love,

Music Notes



The Chancel Choir and friends will present Were You There on That Christmas Night? on Sunday morning, December 19, 11:00 a.m. The

title and theme are built around the song by the same title, Were You There on That Christmas Night?

The music arranger Lloyd Larson has this to say about the presentation: "Obviously, time and location remove any of us from actually being present on the night of Christ's birth. Yet, in the mystery of God's holy ways, all of us in a sense were there."

"God chose ordinary people, Joseph and Mary, as the vessels for fulfilling the incarnation plan—God becoming human. God also chose to reveal the fulfillment of that plan after Christ' birth to shepherds (the most common of people) and to Magi (sophisticated and educated individuals). One can only speculate about the fullest meaning of that strategy, but I (Lloyd Larson) believe it was to convey to us that the Messiah was a gift for all people, regardless of where we reside on the socioeconomic scale. And I believe that the inclusion of Joseph and Mary in such a significant role underscores the importance that each of us have as

vehicles for sharing the message of Christ's birth to our world."

"I think the answer to the question is, 'Yes, I was there.' And so were you! The eternal and timeless nature of God places us in Bethlehem on that Christmas night as we experience anew its joy through the eyes of children, aged saints, enduring carols, and holy scripture: Unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

The Children's Music Activity will sing on Sunday December 12 during the morning worship service. Warm up will be at 10:20 a.m.

The Community Band will present a Christmas concert on Saturday, December 11, at 3:00 p.m. here at First Baptist. The band will perform numerous holiday favorites that you are sure to enjoy.

Remember our **Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion** will begin at 5:00 p.m. and will last under an hour.

The Hanging of the Greens was a most meaningful service. We thank each and every person who helped in any way.


