Perhaps we all have heard phrases like . . . Little things mean a lot! Little is much when God is in it! What a difference a day makes! The importance of one! Just one rose will do! It is better to light just one little candle than to stumble in the dark! O, little town of Bethlehem! As we approach Christmas of 2022, may we remember just how very much God loves each and every one of us . . . and to prove that, in the Gospel of John, one verse, John 3:16, proclaims that God sent His only begotten Son (Jesus) into the world that whosoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life! May we once again really realize and celebrate how important our

Individual lives are as we try to share our faith **one** by **one** with those whom we meet along life's journey. **One** card . . . **one** phone call . . . **one** letter . . . **one** text message . . . **one** visit . . . **one** gift . . . **one** thoughtful act of kindness . . . **one** ? . . . can be used by God to make an eternal difference in the life of the **one** receiving our love . . . compassion . . . and concern. We truly are "blessed to be a blessing," aren't we?

In November of 1978, I was privileged to visit the Holy Land. This was the first **one** of three visits I would be blessed to enjoy while traveling in the land of Jesus . . . today's Israel! **One** of the most unforgettable and spiritually moving experiences of my entire life happened there in **little** Bethlehem. We visited the Church of the Nativity, which is built over the cave where historians feel was the place where the Christ Child was delivered to the world through **one** little girl who would be called the Virgin Mary. As my fellow travelers and I stood in that **one** cave singing, *Silent Night, Holy Night,* God revealed Himself to me in a touching and memorable way. As we sang that beautiful and familiar carol, some children of Bethlehem were standing in the cave with us and as we sang, they were trying to follow the words and the melody as they sang with us. As I looked through the lens of my camera to try to capture that **one** profound moment," I saw the face of **one** little brown-skinned Bethlehem boy who lived and roamed in those Judean hills. **He** was smiling broadly at **me** as we kept trying to all sing together. I suddenly thought, that **one little** face literally could have looked very much like Jesus, who was born in that same **little** village where that **little** boy was living! WOW! I was reminded, as we stood in the birthplace of the **ONE** Savior of the world, that **God** became flesh and dwelt among us so **He** could show us how to live . . . and how to love . . . in following the example of His one and only begotten **Son**, Jesus!

Thank you for joining us in all of our December worship services, events, and occasions to celebrate Jesus together!

Based on what God revealed to me anew in **little** Bethlehem, I wrote the song on page 7 of the newsletter, which I hope can express to you the deep gratitude I have for His matchless and marvelous **gift** whom we celebrate at Christmas . . . and always! Merry . . . happy . . . blessed . . . and joyful Christmas to **you** and **all** of your loved **ones** . . . in Jesus' name and love . . . Wayne Brown

Music Notes



The Children's Music Hymn for the month of December is *Joy* to the World! The Lord Is Come.

Once there was a man named Isaac Watts. He was born in 1674 in England. His parents taught him how important it was to go to church and have a strong faith in Jesus.

As a young boy Isaac was already very smart. He began learning Latin at four years old, and later he learned Greek, Hebrew, and French. He was also very good at making rhymes. Once, during a family worship time, Isaac was heard giggling. When the worship time was over his father asked him why he had laughed. Isaac replied nervously, "I saw a mouse climbing up the bell rope by the fireplace and it made me think of this rhyme: There was a mouse for want of stairs, ran up a rope to say his prayers."

Isaac went on to become a pastor and hymn writer. He was unhappy with many of the hymns of his day, because they were all from the Old Testament. When people sang them, they did not feel anything in their hearts. He wrote over 600 new hymns.

Joy to the World! The Lord Is Come started as a poem. Interestingly, Isaac's words to Joy to the World are his interpretation of Psalm 98. In 1836 Lowell Mason, a musician in America, read the words and put them to music. From that time it has become one of our most beloved Christmas carols.

The Community Band will present a Christmas concert on Sunday, December 4, 3:00 p.m. in our sanctuary. You are invited to attend the concert and


stay around town for the Christmas parade at 6:00 p.m. We have two from our church playing in the band.



I lift my praise, You deserve all majesty.


Now use me, Lord, and help me live for Thee, As Bethlehem, a vessel for Nativity!
