PASTOR'S CORNER

"ADVENT: WHY WE WORSHIP"

Deborah Moore Clark, in her book *O Come, Let us Bow Down and Worship*, lays out five points for why Christians worship God. The five reasons she mentions are:

Obey the Scriptural Command
To Maintain Our Proper Relationship with God
Because God *Is* (See Genesis 3:14-15)
To Form the Community
Because We are Loved

The Advent season is upon us, and what a wonderful time of year to draw our attention to why it is important to worship during this busy season. Each of these five reasons is as important as the next. She expands on these thoughts to explain all of the things worship is *not*. And she rightfully stresses that worship is not a show or entertainment. But instead ought to be approached by every person as fully engaged and participatory. She also states that worship extends far beyond the worship *service*. As we approach this Advent season, may we all strive

to worship God in our daily journey, in all of the little things that we do – because God is worthy of our worship. May we all strive to be fully engaged in worship and fully present, not expecting that our task is to be entertained. We are all members of Christ's church and we all contribute to meaningful communal worship.

So, as we enter one of the busiest times of the year, I pray that you all remember that you are loved, you are valued, and you serve a God who loves you and is worthy of your worship. May the Lord be with you this Advent.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD


A special thanks to Sue Jordan and her helpers for taking care of the shoebox ministry this year for our
