

The duties are listed in the church policy manual that can be viewed at any time in the church office. In short, the committee is responsible for seeking, contacting, and interviewing qualified persons to fill the pulpit during the interim period that the church is without a pastor. Much prayer and time are involved in the work of seeking and vetting candidates. As a congregation, we can help by praying daily for the members of this committee and the work that they do. LENTEN SEASON



Each year we remember the death and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. *Lent* is a season of preparation for this celebration, a time of personal and communal renewal and penitence. As individuals, and as a community, we are invited into a time of intentional self-examination, prayer, meditation upon God's Word, giving of alms, and fasting during the season of Lent. According to *Call to Worship: Volume 48.3*, "Lent is the time to modify our Christian walk and turn toward other parts of our lives that need developing." Like Jesus Christ, who made his journey toward the cross, Lent is that time of year that we commit to making that journey with him.

The season of Lent lasts for 40 days, (leading up to Easter), but does not include Sunday's. The forty days of Lent reflect the biblical significance of the number forty. There are several prominent stories where this number stands out: in the story of Noah God caused it to rain for forty days and forty nights to cause the great flood, Moses spent forty days with God on Mount Sinai, God's people wandered the wilderness for forty years, Elijah trudged toward Mount Horeb for forty days and forty nights, and the prophecy was given to Jonah that the city of Nineveh would be destroyed in forty days. But the best example we have in the Bible of the number forty is after Jesus' baptism, when he went into the wilderness to spend forty days fasting and being tempted by the devil.

Ash Wednesday, February 26, marks the beginning of Lent. Many congregations like ours recognize this season of renewal by holding an Ash Wednesday service. During the service (which usually reflects a more somber mood than most) we usually prepare our hearts and minds for the difficult, self-reflective journey of Lent. The service is typically concluded with the imposition of ashes. This is where the officiating clergy will mark the foreheads of the worshipers with ashes, in the shape of the cross. The imposition of ashes reminds the worshiper of his or her own mortality and need for repentance.

Most Christians use Lent as a time to give something up, or take something on in order to learn dependency upon God through intentional prayer time. What will you commit to giving up or taking on this Lent season?

Colors you will see during the Lenten season.

Lent—Purple—The Royalty of Christ
Holy Week/Pentecost Sunday—Red—The Blood of Christ
Easter—White—The Purity of Christ and The Joy of the season
