PASTOR'S CORNER



Enoch walked with God three hundred years, and had sons and daughters.
(Genesis 5:22)

Isn't it wonderful how God's Word compares the Christian life not only to running a race, but also to walking a walk? Hence, the whole idea of pacing ourselves becomes extremely important. In 40:31, the prophet Isaiah boldly proclaims, "But those who wait on the Lord

shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." So, in other words...just keep on keepin' on!

In the book of Genesis we learn about a man named Enoch who walked with God for three hundred years. That's a long time! Enoch teaches us the importance of pacing ourselves throughout our spiritual race. I think this is very important for us to consider since we all know of folks who have what I call a yo-yo relationship with God. We can see this played out in a variety of ways. They might be fully backslidden. They might bounce from church to church looking for who knows what. And sometimes they might become passionate in their zeal for Jesus almost to the point of becoming obnoxious. They haven't learned to pace themselves.

As we all know, we will go through seasonal changes - in our own personal ministry, as well as our corporate church life. The need for proper pacing is something I know a little bit about. Back in my years while playing baseball I was always known to be a very fast runner. Being a left handed batter, I was good at laying a bunt down the 3rd base line - and would often run it out for a base hit. In left field, if a ball was hit in the air; I was going to run it down and catch it. I was confident that there was no way that that ball was going to hit the ground. Although I was very fast on my feet, the problem was that I was only interested in short bursts (sprints) - not long distance marathons. Short blasts are what I looked for, and not much more than that. I could often sprint a single into a double. But if I tried to make it into a triple, I would frequently get thrown out at third base. My initial blast of energy between first and second base would begin to conk out by the time I reached third. I was running hard, but fast slowing down.

The same is true of our spiritual race. The objective is not to just run fast. Our objective is to run long. So if we want to grow up spiritually, then we need to pace ourselves in this race of life - because we are in it for the long haul.

May God bless you all as we continue to forge ahead in Christ!




