PASTOR'S CORNER



After the servant had done this, he reported, 'There is still room for more.' So his master said, 'Go out into the hedges and urge anyone you find to come, so that the house will be full. For none of those I first invited will get even the smallest taste of my banquet.' Luke 14: 22 - 24.

"Come to God's house at First Baptist, and see that IT IS GOOD!" While I may not say it EXACTLY like this, I do try to always roll out the welcome mat for folks that I come across in Whiteville. I especially like how the book of Romans puts it: Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you. Some will take you up on your invitation, and many will not. But here's something

that we all know: EVERYONE needs the love of Jesus Christ! Everyone. And what better way than in a wholesome, family-friendly, loving Christian environment? What better way to make life-long friends than in the holy house of God? In the great commission in Matthew 28:19-20 Jesus says, Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

I have always been enamored with the little book by authors Ken Hemphill and Mike James entitled "V.E.L.C.R.O. CHURCH" I think the catchy little title says it all. There's no real need for explanation here. Velcro, commercially known as being a "zipperless zipper" was originally designed by Swiss electrical engineer George de Mestral. George discovered that when nylon was sewn under hot infrared light, it formed nearly perfect hooks for the hook side of the fastener. Velcro got its first break when the aerospace industry used it for the purpose of helping astronauts to maneuver in and out of their bulky space suits. Skiers saw many similarities between their costumes and those of astronauts and introduced Velcro to the ski industry. Children's clothing makers would soon come onboard. And the rest, as they say, is history!

So what about the <u>"V.E.L.C.R.O. CHURCH"</u>? Wouldn't it be wonderful - wouldn't it be fantastic - if we could attach one side of Velcro to our church and the other to everyone who visits so that they would become permanently stuck to the body of Christ? WOW! But tragically, many churches (just look around our communities) more often resemble Teflon - rather than Velcro. People will come for a visit then simply not return. They come, but then quickly "slip away". Here are a few facts that help explain why we desperately need to "Velcroize" our churches.

FOUR VELCRO FACTS

FACT #1: Your church cannot grow without guests.

FACT #2: Your church cannot grow if your guests don't come back.

FACT #3: You never get a second chance to make a great first impression.

FACT #4: Your church cannot grow if people join, and then drop out.

Moving forward, may we at First Baptist Whiteville consider using this simple acronym **V.E.L.C.R.O.** We **V**alue every person who steps foot in our church as being a gift from God. We **E**ngage every visitor with intentionality. Not only are we an extremely friendly church, WE ARE KNOWN FOR IT! With everything we say, and everything we do - we **L**ead our friends in the direction of Christ. We **C**onnect new visitors by introducing them to others within our church - suggesting a Sunday school class, inviting them to our "Church After Church" fellowship lunch, or one of our Wednesday prayer services. At First Baptist we **R**ecognize that establishing healthy relationships is what is key to fostering positive growth in God's House. At First Baptist we will also look for ways to **O**rganize small group activities within a healthy Christian context inside our church. The opportunities are endless!

Velcro creates a powerful bond that is difficult to break. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could "bind" visitors and new members to Christ in such a way that it becomes a permanent seal in Christian love and community? In 2025 I believe that we can make great strides towards doing this very thing! Much like a "V.E.L.C.R.O CHURCH", let us dedicate ourselves to making First Baptist Whiteville an ongoing opportunity to bring the great commission to every person who steps inside our walls.

Take My Life and Let It Be

A Prayer Lived Out in Life

Frances Ridley Havergal (1836-1879) of England began writing verse at age seven. Her insatiable thirst for the Bible led her to memorize the entire New Testament, Psalms, Isaiah, and the Minor Prophets. She was a concert contralto soloist and a brilliant classical pianist. She gave her life to Christ at age fifteen.

At age twenty-one she stood in the art gallery at Dusseldorf, Germany, looking at the painting of the crucifixion with the engraving beneath it "This I have done for thee; what has thou done for Me?" In the previous century the wealthy young Count Zinzendorf of Moravian missionary fame read these same words and was led to consecrate his life to Christ. As she stood there, her very soul was stirred. Tears cascaded down her cheeks. From that moment she dedicated her talents to the service of the Lord.

Throughout her life she was frail and delicate in health and died at the early age of forty-two. When she wrote "Take my life, and let it be consecrated, Lord, to Thee," it was for her a prayer. And when she penned the words, "Take my silver and my gold," she did exactly that! She gave fifty pieces of jewelry (heirlooms) to the Church Missionary Society, including a jewel cabinet that she said was "fit for a countess." She retained only a brooch for daily wear that was a memorial of her parents, and a locket with a portrait of her niece who had gone to heaven. Of that experience she wrote, "I don't think I need tell you I never packed a box with such pleasure." Despite the dark nights of frequent sickness and suffering, the dedicated life of this poetess can best be summed up in her own prayer lyrics.

Take My Life and Let It Be

Take my life and let it be Consecrated, Lord, to Thee; Take my hands and let them move At the impulse of Thy love, At the impulse of Thy love.

Take my feet and let them be Swift and beautiful for Thee; Take my voice and let me sing Always, only, for my King, Always, only, for my King. Take my silver and my gold, Not a mite would I withhold; Take my moments and my days, Let them flow in ceaseless praise, Let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my will and make it Thine, It shall be no longer mine; Take my heart, it is Thine own, It shall be Thy royal throne, It shall be Thy royal throne.


BAPTIST MEN'S SUNDAY

SPREADING THE WORD

In his article for *On Mission* magazine, "Faithful to Share", president of the North American Mission Board, Kevin Ezell, states, "So often we miss opportunities to share our faith because we worry that we won't say the right things. While we do need to know the basics, using eloquent words has never been a prerequisite to leading someone to Christ. Many years ago, at a church I pastored, we used an evangelism tool call *FAITH*. It teaches believers to share the gospel by walking through an acrostic." (pictured at left)

Sharing our faith is exactly what the Lord would have us do. He leaves us here after He saves us so that we can bring more people into a believing relationship with Him. He wants us to share the faith and hope we have in Him with a world that does not know or may not understand that they need a relationship with God to go to heaven.

SHARING YOUR FAITH

While you are "Spreading the Word" to those around you, we though it would be helpful to have a quick reference list of Bible verses that explain salvation from why we need salvation to how we can receive God's free gift of salvation.

1.) We are all Sinners

Romans 3:23—For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God

2.) Our payment for sin is death

Romans 6:23—For the wages of sin is death: but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

3.) There is hope through the blood of Jesus Christ

Romans 5:8—But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

4.) Repent (change your mind) and Believe on Jesus Christ

Acts 16:30-31—And brought them out, and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house."

Johns 3:18—He that believeth on Him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

John 3:16—For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

I Thessalonians 1:9—For they themselves shew of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God;

5.) It's everlasting, It's a Gift! You have not earned it!

Ephesians 2:8-9—For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast.

6.) Now you know how to get to heaven

1 John 5:13—These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God, that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God.

Ask God to save you in the name of Jesus!

Romans 10:10—For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.
