PASTOR'S CORNER:



During our Wednesday night discipleship studies we have been exploring the book "The Equipping Church" by Sue Mallory. A few weeks ago we read a quote by Rick Warren that guided a lot of our discussion that night. Warren said, "Vision is being alert to opportunities."

In 2016 our pastor applied to participate in *Clergy Making a Place: Early Career Pastors as Generative Community Leaders* through the Wake Forest School of Divinity. Out of nearly seventy applicants Ryan was one of the fifteen selected. As a part of this initiative he will have the opportunity to travel with the group to Nicaragua for a mission trip.

In Nicaragua, the group will be working with AMOS Health and Hope. AMOS seeks to improve the health of impoverished communities by working alongside them in health, education, and development. But this opportunity is more than a mission trip. It will also be a learning experience for our young pastor as he seeks to understand more about poverty, health, and possible ways our congregation can make an impact in our community.

DID YOU KNOW . . .?

As we look back on that very first Christmas when Jesus Christ was born, did you know that there probably was no "inn"?

The Greek word that is used in Luke 2:7 is *kataluma*, which in this instance probably refers to a lodging room or dining room – it is also translated as "guest room" or "upper room."

You may be familiar with another time when *kataluma* is used in the Gospel of Luke – during the Passover meal with the disciples. In Mark 14:14, Jesus asks, "Where is my **guest room** where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" (NRSV).

Still not convinced? Later on in the Gospel of Luke, in 10:34, he refers to a public inn and uses a completely different word, *pandocheion*. Why the switch of words if indeed Luke wanted to imply that Mary and Joseph were staying at a public inn?

Historians have taught us that most peasant families in Bethlehem would have lived in a small two story home with the living quarters upstairs and the valuable animals would be stored downstairs at night. The feeding troughs, or mangers, would have been built into the floor. The kataluma of most peasants' homes would not have been a large area. On the contrary, it would have been very small, thus, why Jesus would have been placed in the manger of the "lower room" with the animals.

Though there was probably no "inn" as we think of today, and this might change our understanding of the narrative a bit, but the meaning stays unchanged. Jesus, our God, came to us where we live. He entered into our normalcy, not as a royal king to be exalted, but as a lowly peasant, here to serve humanity in the most humble of ways.

As we begin 2018, we should consider how great God's love is, that he is willing to step into the normalcy of our lives!
