PASTOR'S CORNER:

"KEEPING THE CELEBRATION ALIVE"

John 2:1-11

Christmas is over. The presents have been opened; the decorations have been put away; our family visits have ended. By now we're beginning to consider our new year resolutions and considering ways we may improve our lives. I can't help but recall the wedding of Cana, (a celebration in the Gospels that doesn't get a lot of airtime in Baptist circles).

At the wedding, Jesus' mother, Mary, becomes concerned because the wine has run out. She knows this means that the party will be over, so, she takes her concern (somewhat frantically) directly to Jesus. I think we have somewhat of a humorous moment here when Jesus basically asks her what this has to do with him, and she, like only a mother can, puts him in his place. Rather than respond to his query she orders the servants to "Do whatever he tells you to do." While this is the first of Jesus' miracles ever recorded in the Gospels, you can't help but wonder if Mary has seen Jesus do this before, as she seems to be privy to the process that will follow.

And what does Jesus do? He uses the servants by asking them to fill the jars to the brim with water – they comply. What he does next is a miracle. He turns water into wine! Water has no physical or chemical traits that could ever have the potential of becoming wine. So, this story teaches a lot about the transformative powers of Jesus. It also teaches us about being willing to follow his instructions, no matter what; and to never doubt what Jesus can do with us if we just obey.

But more than anything, I think it is important for us to consider why Mary made this request to begin with. Mary made this request to Jesus because she was concerned that the party will end. Once the wine is gone, the crowd will have little reason to stick around. As we begin a new year, let us be filled with new wine and seek to keep the celebration alive. When you invite Jesus to the party, just when you think the celebration is over, it has really just begun.








QUARTERLY CHURCH CONFERENCE
