So whether on the evening news station, in the local barber shop, or perhaps even during small talk as we await the beginning of our Sunday School class - when was the last time you heard the statement "American Christianity is dying"? My guess is that it probably wasn't all that long ago.

And we only have to take a quick look at the pews of our sanctuaries in our houses of worship in order to bear this out, right? Maybe, maybe not. But just hear this: I happen to believe that the Good News of Jesus Christ is just as alive and well as it has ever been!

Our demographics might be changing—this we cannot deny. Society itself is definitely changing. <u>But here's the best news of all:</u> While we might want to look in the mirror and consider any changes that may be appropriate regarding our church's particular "Christian Brand", or even how we go about our usual style of Sunday worship as it pertains to meeting the needs of God's children in our community... **WE SERVE A GOD WHO NEVER CHANGES!** Yes, He's the ONE constant throughout.

So moving forward, perhaps we might want to ask the question, "How can I love my neighbor even better than I do now?" I think this is a good question for us to ask.


Summertime is finally here. Hard working people everywhere are looking to include a little bit of fun in their lives. I happen to be a pastor who believes that although we don't attend church in order to *have fun*, fun is definitely able to be found in church. Or at least, plug in the word enjoyment for fun if that makes us feel better!

"American Christianity is dying." I am here to tell you that nothing could be further from the truth - especially right now. People everywhere are looking for His Spirit. And we are His messengers. Again, every few months this headline rings out in secular and religious newspapers, during the nightly news, and on social media. Bolstered with studies that reveal Americans less willing to identify with traditional religious groups, Christians and non-Christians alike claim we are witnessing the long-awaited collapse of American Christianity. And this is one of the deceivers greatest tools. But we won't fall for it - because we know better.

Just remember when I once told you that "THE TRUTH COMES IN THE SHAPE OF A CROSS." Let's hang onto my previous question because I think it's very important: "How can I love my neighbor even better than I do now?"

For answers to these questions we can go directly to the Word of God. Paul encourages us with this reminder: "imitate me, just as I imitate Christ". (1 Corinthians 11:1 NLT). Here's our answer... We are to act like the One whom we want to seem like. And I am CONVINCED that numerous folks all around us are going to respond. We will see this in brand new visits to church on Sunday mornings, folks showing up for our "movie nights", Tuesday night Bible studies, Wednesday evening prayer service, and on and on.

In conclusion, many bemoan the decline of the church. But new research reveals that unchurched Americans are surprisingly more receptive and open to the Christian faith than is commonly assumed. And as far as our neighbors go? **LOVE THEM! INVITE THEM! AND ENJOY THEM!** This might just be what they have been needing all along.


CHILDREN'S SUMMER PROGRAM
