PASTOR'S CORNER "NO PLACE FOR PESSIMISM"



"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed

to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned." Romans 12:1-3

When I was in my early twenties and beginning to become more involved with my local church in Newport News, Virginia, I finally worked up the courage to begin attending Sunday School. The perspective with which this particular Sunday School teacher approached the world was that the world's purpose was to make her life more comfortable.

Therefore, when the world doesn't respond in kind, there is a problem. The Christian approach toward life can never be a pessimistic one. We are to be lovers of God's creation and servants of the people. A good servant never complains about his work, but instead, seeks to serve in a capacity that brings about the goodness that one hopes for.

The cup from which we drink is half-full. Our task is to work to fill it up by presenting ourselves as living sacrifices. Let us approach with joy the tasks that God has given us and work diligently to bring his Kingdom to earth here in our community.

Their trip takes place June 26-July 2.




FBC MEMBER SPOTLIGHT ROSE LANGSTON

This summer, CBF Global General Assembly is practically, in our back yard!


