

# PASTOR'S CORNER: "PSALM 23"



The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

It always amazes me that this psalm is always associated with death considering its application for living an abundant life. Read the words again over and over and let the words seep into your soul. The emotional, spiritual, and even physical effects those words have upon us are tremendous!

Perhaps it does make sense, though, that we recite these words to the dying and to the grieving at funerals. As we stare death in the face, we realize we need a courage that goes beyond anything physical can teach us. Perhaps we should also not wait until we are staring death in the face before we muster up the courage to seek out God's Spirit for daily application.

May the words of Psalm 23 truly mean something to us...not simply for dying a good death; but also for living a good life.

# FBC SPOTLIGHT

This month's Spotlight highlights the Wednesday Night Supper Committee.

Wednesday Night Supper – Fellowship and Bible Study

Wednesday Night Suppers have been a long-time tradition at First Baptist Church. A committee of three church members is recruited by the nominating committee. The primary function of the Wednesday Night Supper Committee is to enlist ten groups consisting of a chairman and, in some groups, a co-chairman. Each of these ten groups is assigned three or four Wednesday nights for which they are responsible for planning a menu, purchasing and preparing the food, setting up serving tables, and cleaning the kitchen after the meal. All of this is accomplished while making every effort to stay within a budget not to exceed the amount of money collected for the meal. The cost of a meal is \$4.00 for adults, \$2.00 for children, with a cap of \$20.00 per family. We currently have 66 church members assigned to supper groups.

The meal is followed by Bible Study led by the pastor unless a special program is planned in connection with a holiday or other event. During the adult study, children go to another area for a weekly program, Godly Play.

We will discontinue the meal during the summer months except on the third Wednesday of June and August. The June meal will be provided by the Gleaners Sunday School Class; in July we will have a covered dish supper on the fourth Wednesday in conjunction with church conference; the August meal will be provided by the Ruth Believers Sunday School Class. There will be ice cream or some other type of light refreshment served on the remaining Wednesday nights.

There is always a spot for additional members to serve on a supper group!! It involves planning, preparation, and work; however, it is a rewarding place of service in the church. If you are willing to join a cooking group, please contact one of the Wednesday Night Supper Committee members:




# YOUTH LUNCH
