PASTOR'S CORNER



So another Memorial Day has come and passed. And we had a joyous celebration on Sunday in God's house. I sincerely hope that we were all able to spend some quality time with our beloved families.

But as we stood up and acknowledged our heroes in gratitude and faith, something else quickly came to mind. The many freedoms that we enjoy in this beautiful country - land of the free, home of the brave - while rock solid in their declaration and establishment...they can sometimes also appear to be extremely fragile and delicate. So we must be willing to guard

these freedoms with everything we've got.

And can't the same be said as it pertains to our walk with Christ? I think that now perhaps more than ever, we need to make sure to walk with the full armor of Christ. In Ephesians 6:10-20, the Apostle Paul teaches us that a vital aspect of having the image of God renewed in us is that we wear the same armor that Jesus wore. Verse 11 tells us "Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil."

Growing up in Baltimore in the 60's, one of my favorite baseball players was shortstop Mark Belanger. Tall, thin, and lanky of build - they used to call number 7, Mark Belanger, "The Blade". To be sure, if a ground ball was hit anywhere in the vicinity of "The Blade", good luck reaching first base safely.

In the Bible, the number seven represents completeness and fullness as well as to signify protection, and it comes up regularly especially throughout the book of Revelation:

- > seven churches (1:4, 11, 20)
- > seven golden lamp stands (1:12-13, 20; 2:1)
- > seven stars (1:16, 20; 2:1; 3:1)
- > seven spirits (1:4; 3:1; 4:5; 5:6)
- > seven lamps (4:5)
- > seven seals (5:1, 5)
- > seven horns (5:6)

These are but a few of the many mentions of seven in Revelation. And sometimes when that number is used in Scripture, it means that something hasn't yet reached its full expression. So from these passages with messages to the seven churches, we can infer that Jesus **WANTS THEM ALL** to be complete, fulfilled, and not lacking in any way.

And this same promise is offered to all of us in our own individual Christ walk. Let it be so! "If you overcome in these seven areas, you will have overcome completely and perfectly. You will be living out the complete and abundant life I came to supply rather than the life of defeat Satan offers." (John 10:9-10).

Another Memorial Day is behind us and Summer is finally here. Let us rejoice and give thanks for the many blessings that God has placed upon us. The harvest is His, so may we carry on with the good works that He has lovingly given to each of us!
