PASTOR'S CORNER: TESTING THE SPIRITS

"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil." Matthew 4:1, NRSV

"Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world." 1 John 4:1, NRSV

This March, we begin the Lenten season. Lent is a time for us to "test the spirits." This is the only way we can know, and recognize, which voice is from God, and which voices are not. There's a reason that Jesus' ministry began by the Holy Spirit driving him out into the wilderness.

Jesus' journey was to be a long one; it was a difficult, intentional journey that led him to walk to his own death (a miserable one, at that). Jesus' time in the wilderness was a preparation for what was to come, but it was also a time for discernment.

- "What, God, do you want me to do?"
- "Who should join me in the work for which you are calling me?"
- "Where do you want me to go?"
- "Who do you want me to go to?"

Will you join me, in this season of Lent, to test the spirits, in order to get better at hearing the still, small voice of God? Will you join First Baptist Church in a season in the wilderness, where we are sure to also come face to face with temptation, in order that we might learn true dependency upon our maker?

Our journey will begin at our Ash Wednesday service, March 1 at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary.



DID YOU KNOW?

Each year we remember and celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which he overcame death and provided for us a redemption from sin. *Lent* is a season of preparation for this celebration, a time of personal and communal renewal and penitence. As individuals, and as a community, we are invited into a time of intentional self-examination, prayer, meditation upon God's Word, giving of alms, and fasting during the season of Lent. According to *Call to Worship: Volume 48.3*, "Lent is the time to modify our Christian walk and turn toward other parts of our lives that need developing." Like Jesus Christ, who made his journey toward the cross, Lent is that time of year that we commit to making that journey with him.

The season of Lent lasts for 40 days, (leading up to Easter), but does not include Sunday's. The forty days of Lent reflect the biblical significance of the number forty. There are several prominent stories where this number stands out: in the story of Noah God caused it to rain for forty days and forty nights to cause the great flood, Moses spent forty days with God on Mount Sinai and his people wandered the wilderness for forty years, Elijah trudged toward Mount Horeb for forty days and forty nights, and the prophecy was given to Jonah that the city of Nineveh would be destroyed in forty days. But the best example we have in the Bible of the number forty is after Jesus' baptism, when he was driven into the wilderness by the Holy Spirit to spend forty days fasting and being tempted by the devil.

Did you know that *Ash Wednesday* marks the beginning of Lent? Many congregations like ours recognize this season of renewal by holding an Ash Wednesday service. During the service (which usually reflects a more somber mood than most) we usually prepare our hearts and minds for the difficult, self-reflective journey of Lent. The service is typically concluded with the imposition of ashes. This is where the officiating clergy will mark the foreheads of the worshipers with ashes, in the shape of the cross. The imposition of ashes reminds the worshiper of his or her own mortality and need for repentance.

Most Christians use Lent as a time to give something up, or take something on in order to learn dependency upon God through intentional prayer time. What will you commit to giving up or taking on this Lent season?
