

PASTOR'S CORNER



"The Lord doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

1 Samuel 16: 7, NLT

So again let us be reminded: as followers of Christ we are each called to encounter a broad variety of others who are around us. And trust me when I tell you - they are there for a specific reason. One of the most difficult things to envision is the dark world into which Jesus has commanded us to *BE THE LIGHT* of the world. Here's a little food for thought: It's when

the jar breaks, that our lamps will really begin to shine. That's right. Why? Well, it's because God does great things with broken pieces. He always has. And His Holy Word is replete with such stories that bear this out. Both the old AND the new. There's Joseph and Rahab. David, and Jonah too. And of course let us not forget our friends Peter and Paul, formerly Saul. To be sure, God specializes in allowing light to shine through previously broken pieces. It's the same thing He does with us!

Many people of faith become entrenched in "doing faith" through Bible studies, attending church, or reading Christian books and forget about "living faith" in order for them to shine for God. Now please don't get me wrong, the above described activities are wonderful resources in which we can further enhance our Christian witness. They are. But they should not attempt to replace what we read when **Matthew 5:14** tells us "You are the light of the world". We must always remember that we have been formed (and so often re-formed) into being His light that shines.

Let's think of it this way: The world says "How do you do?" But Jesus says, "How do you live?" Because it's right here that I sincerely think makes all the difference. Right now, how do the citizens of First Baptist Whiteville live? Are we approachable? Are we interested? Are we accessible? Are we concerned? And as Jesus might ask, "Are we disciples who are making other disciples?" Now with all of this it sure sounds like we are each destined to be very busy people. It also sounds like we have our work cut out for us. And I think that we would be right ON BOTH ACCOUNTS. But this is a big part of what's really exciting about ministry. ONE: I (we) have a lot of work to do. TWO: I am (we are) very qualified to effectively get this work done. God already makes this imminently clear, as He wouldn't have placed us here otherwise. THREE: He never leaves us on our own. "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Not only does our God give us explicit directives in written form, He has also demonstrated each and every one of them in person. Remember, GOD IS LOVE.

And now, as a vibrant, living, breathing church body - it's our turn. It's our turn to do what He has already done! It's our turn to join in and do what He's continuing to do right now! For an encouraging rallying cry let us look to the words of Paul in **Romans 13:11**: "Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed." You are the light! So how do you live - as one who sets off the glow of God? Are we employed with the occupation of being disciples who make other disciples? Again, **THE TIME IS NOW.** First Baptist let us "buddy up", because there is no need for us to feel that we have to do this on our own. On Sunday, March 2 PREPARE FOR OUR HEART'S TO BE SET ABLAZE as we begin to see the children in our church taking on a more active role within all facets of God worship. Why are they doing this? Why now? Because they asked to! Because they said they want to!

AND BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT THEY NEED TO!

I'm very excited, can you tell? And First Baptist Whiteville, *I HOPE AND PRAY* that you are excited too! Our days ahead are bright - because **YOU ARE THE LIGHT.**

In Jesus' holy name may we offer the love of His heart's content to someone who needs Him RIGHT NOW!

OBSERVING SEASONS

As Baptists, we are believers in freedom. We are not religiously obligated to observe Ash Wednesday, Lent, or any other season; instead we do so by free choice. We can *choose* to participate. That is what makes special services such powerful opportunities for worship—we *choose* to follow Jesus just like He chose to die for us.

This month we celebrate Ash Wednesday. It is the first day of the season of Lent, and Lent is the forty days, excluding Sundays, before Easter. Its name comes from the imposition of ashes on the head which reminds us that we are dust. It has been traditional in the church to have a service that day in which we spend time taking spiritual stock of our lives. The service is meant to be a time of spiritual reflection and confession as we think on the reality of Easter.

Ash Wednesday is March 5 this year. On Ash Wednesday, we typically give up something to show our love for Christ. Perhaps this year, we can DO something more in Jesus' name rather than giving up something that is easy. We also invite you to attend Lenten services at Whiteville United Methodist Church as a way to focus attention on Christ and His sacrifice for us.

AM I REALLY GOING TO HEAVEN?

If you don't know the Lord as your personal Savior, wouldn't this be the perfect time of year to begin your relationship with Him? Just because you are a member of a church does not mean that you will go to heaven when you pass from this life. Not everyone who calls out to me, 'Lord! Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Only those who actually do the will of My Father in heaven will enter. On judgment day many will say to Me, 'Lord! Lord! We prophesied in Your name and cast out demons in Your name and performed many miracles in Your name.' But I will reply, 'I never knew you. Get away from Me, you who break God's laws.'

Matthew 7:21-23

1.) We are all Sinners

Romans 3:23—For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God

2.) Our payment for sin is death

Romans 6:23—For the wages of sin is death: but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

3.) There is hope through the blood of Jesus Christ

Romans 5:8—But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

4.) Repent (change your mind) and Believe on Jesus Christ

I Thessalonians 1:9—For they themselves shew of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God;

5.) It's everlasting, It's a Gift! You have not earned it!

Ephesians 2:8-9—For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast.

6.) Now you know how to get to heaven

1 John 5:13—These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God, that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God.

Ask God to save you in the name of Jesus!

Romans 10:10—For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.










JOURNEY TO THE CROSS
