PASTOR'S CORNER



We began our new year of 2021 celebrating the beautiful gift of PRAYER! The disciples did not ask Jesus to teach them to fish, perform miracles, or to preach, but they asked Him, Lord, teach us to pray! (Luke 11:1) Throughout the month of January, we focused on THE LORD'S PRAYER, the model prayer Jesus taught His disciples and which we as His disciples continue to be blessed to pray personally and corporately! During the first month of our new year, we prayed the prayer in corporate worship . . . we heard different arrangements of the prayer in musical settings . . . we dramatized it with Betty Jo Prevatte . . . and we sang in unison as a congregation Albert Hay Malotte's well known version of the prayer. Also, during January we emphasized ASK: Ask, Seek, Knock! We learned a simple pattern of

prayer is the **ACTS** model, building a "Prayer Tower to God" through the various levels of **A**doration, **C**onfession, **T**hanksgiving, and **S**upplication . . . praying always "in Jesus' name!"

In February, we focused on **LOVE**: where, what, who, and that the greatest gift of all is God's unconditional . . . self-denying . . . selfless . . . indescribable love shown through Jesus Christ, His Son, dying on the cross for our sins and the sins of the entire world! On Valentine's Day, Sunday, February 14th, we were blessed to hear a wonderful message from our talented organist, Reverend Patricia Slomanski, as she shared, "My Heart--Christ's Home" based on the book with that same title by Robert Boyd Munger. I told Patricia following the Morning Worship Service, *Well done, thou good and faithful servant!* She presented a meaningful and heart-felt message! As a gift from the church, we gave a copy of the book to each household present in worship on that special day. We also gave with each book, a beautiful Valentine Patricia had personally made and decorated as a gift for the congregation, on which was an original poem she had written, *Jesus Is My Valentine*. In case you did not receive a copy of the valentine, I want to share Patricia's poem with you here:

The Lenten Season began with Ash Wednesday. Lent is 40 days in length (representing Christ's 40 days in the wilderness) excluding Sundays. During these 40 days

we are challenged to prepare our hearts for that which is to come, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and finally Resurrection Sunday. Our organist, Patricia Slomanski, has prepared a Lenten booklet that she wishes to share with us. Those will be given out as soon as they are finalized and printed.

Palm Sunday is March 28. Maundy Thursday is April 1. Good Friday is April 2 Resurrection Sunday is April 4.

The Chancel Choir, soloists, and instrumentalists continue to prepare music for these important worship services.

I pray that this Lenten season we will personally and corporately draw closer to our Lord. Likewise, I

pray that each of us will renew and reignite our relationship with each other as Jesus proclaims in Matthew 22:37-40:
