PASTOR'S CORNER: "GAINING CLARITY"



Many of you are aware that we are at a very critical point in the life of our congregation. Our congregation is operating with a lot of trust in God, but also in one another. Our potential for ministry is increasing *daily*. For clarity purposes I want to help to illuminate what I

believe would be a healthy process as we begin to take our next few steps.

Prayer and Visioning Team – Our Deacon Body and Church Council are in the process of gaining clarity about the best approach for listening to God's voice. But it is always a good process to spend focused time in prayer listening to the voice of our Lord, the Good Shepherd.

We live in a loud world – and most of it is our fault. We turn on the radio in the car. We turn on the televisions in our homes. We have our computers and loud equipment on at work and our cell phones in our hands all the other times of the day. We fill our lives with lots of noise and busyness. We simply do not *listen* enough.

We would benefit from assembling a team whose function is to spend time – a year, maybe even two, to leave *our agendas* at home and actively listen to the guidance of our Good Shepherd. Through prayer and discernment, the Lord will shape our vision and help us to gain clarity about who we are to become. If we are paying attention to the voice of our Heavenly Father, it *will* transform us. Focused prayer is important!

Jeremiah 42:2-3: "The prophet Jeremiah said, 'Be good enough to listen to our plea, and pray to the Lord your God for us—for all this remnant. For there are only a few of us left out of many, as your eyes can see. Let the Lord your God show us where we should go and what we should do.'" Beyond that, we have no way of knowing the specifics of what God will "say" to our prayer and visioning team. Being the people of God, that ought not to scare us. But there are undoubtedly some people who are uncomfortable with the **uncertainty**. But that does not mean that we cannot bring clarity to what the next steps will be.

The Equipping Church & Spiritual Gifts Studies

(Ephesians 4:11-16, 1 Corinthians 12:1, 8-10, 28, Romans 12:6-8, 1 Peter 4:9-10, Exodus 31:3-5, 1 Timothy 2:1-2, Psalm 150:3-5) – The conversations we have been having on Wednesday nights will guide our future. Becoming a church that is lay-led where people serve out of their giftedness and passion is based on God's design as it is laid out in the Bible. It is the vision for our future.

How does it make you feel that God has given you spiritual gifts? Do you know what your spiritual gifts are? Not everyone is as capable as they once were. But that does not mean that they don't have a purpose here. Per our conversations on Wednesday nights, that also means a shift in the way the people understand the pastor's role. If we make the shift to become an equipping church I will spend much more of my time working to **equip** the lay leaders for their roles of service in the church and much less time being the "Doer" of ministry. I encourage all of you to read the book "The Equipping Church" by Sue Mallory from cover to cover if you haven't done so already.

I want to thank each and every member of this church for the faith and courage you continue to show. God is moving and I continue to hear from people who are finding a renewed sense of passion in their ministry in and with First Baptist Church. *Your* leadership in our faith community is paying off and I cannot wait to see where the Lord will take us!

Music in Ministry



Occasionally, I am asked why we read as much scripture in worship as we do, which reminds me of my New Testament class in seminary. My New Testament professor spent as much time with us studying the Old Testament as he did studying the New Testament. He would say, "to understand the New Testament, we must also understand the Old Testament. The New

Testament is the fulfillment of the Old Testament."

As an example of his instruction, we can look at Pentecost Sunday, which is May 20. The New Testament reading for Pentecost is Acts 2:1-21. Verses 17-21 is a quote from Joel 2:28-32. The Epistle reading for Pentecost is Romans 8:22-27. Verse 22 references Jeremiah 12:11. and verse 26 references Zechariah 12:10. Our Psalm reading for Pentecost Sunday is Psalm 104:24-34. Verse 30 states "When you send forth your spirit they are create; and you renew the face of the ground." The Gospel reading is John 10:26-27 and 16:4b-15. John 16:13 states "However, when the Spirit of Truth comes, he will guide you in all truth ... "

Each Sunday we read and study God's Holy Word from Genesis to Revelation. The hymn The Word of God Is Alive expresses it thusly:

The Word of God is alive, It lives in the world today; Correcting, consoling, connecting mankind, The Word of God is alive.

The Word of God is a fire, It flames with eternal truth; Refining, revealing, reclaiming our love, The Word of God is a fire.

The Word of God is a lamp, It shines through the darkest night; Perceiving, perfecting, protecting our walk, The Word of God is a lamp.

The Word of God is inspired, It speaks to our deepest needs; Dividing, directing, declaring His truth, The Word of God is inspired.

Perhaps God's Spirit is prompting you to join one of our music groups as we share God's Word through music. Join us this week!
