PASTOR'S CORNER



Perhaps we all have heard, "The best laid schemes of mice and men often go awry, and leave us nothing but grief and pain, for promised joy!" (Robert Burns in "To A Mouse") Often our plans are made today and then tomorrow comes to change their direction altogether. Years ago, when we were on a mission tour with the youth from one of our previous churches, and things were not going exactly the way we thought they should be going, my wife, Joy, famously and memorably said, "On a youth mission tour, the eleventh commandment should be, 'Thou shalt be flexible!'" Those words have stuck with us through the years and we have used them at various times! We have learned that they apply not just to youth mission tours,

but to life in general! Life does **not** always go exactly as we think it would . . . could . . . should . . . or, at least maybe **not** in the direction we had quite planned for it to go!
