PASTOR'S CORNER



"If I could speak all the languages of earth and of angels, but didn't love others, I would only be a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal."

1 Corinthians 13: 1

In response to the above scripture - *SO TRUE!* It's our love that indeed surpasses all other spiritual gifts. And as we are fast approaching the season of Holy Advent, let us not lose sight of this fact. In ways big and small, I see a bold display of this kind of "crazy love" love all around us. For one, it's from a deep place within their hearts that so many of the good folks at First Baptist are giving generously on behalf of our

brothers and sisters who are in distress in Western North Carolina. As in all things - to God be the glory! Speaking of love, consider our upcoming Homecoming service that's set and ready to go for Sunday, November 3. Well let's just say it like this: **190 YEARS.** The love AND the excitement is definitely in the air as we prepare to celebrate!

From verses one to thirteen this passage gives one of the most complete descriptions of love in the Bible. More importantly, it shows that love needs to be the one thing in life that we seek more than anything else. Without it, whatever we do or say really has no lasting value. Compare the love described here with the superficial love found in this world. Notice that Paul focuses more on what love does than on what love is.

- > God says love should be directed toward others (1 Corinthians 13:1-3). The world says love should be directed toward yourself.
- > God says love is patient and kind (1 Corinthians 13:4). The world says love should satisfy your immediate needs.
- > God says love is never jealous or envious (1 Corinthians 13:4). The world says love means that you deserve "the best."
- > God says love is never boastful or proud (1 Corinthians 13:4).

 The world says love isn't necessary to make people respect you.
- > God says love is never rude (1 Corinthians 13:5).
 The world says love lets you act as you please.
- > God says love does not demand its own way (1 Corinthians 13:5). The world says love gets in the way of what you want.
- > God says that love is not irritable or touchy, and it holds no grudges (1 Corinthians 13:5). The world says love takes a backseat when it comes to seeking revenge.
- > God says love rejoices in justice and truth (1 Corinthians 13:6). The world says love understands even ignores evil.
- > God says love is loyal (1 Corinthians 13:7).
 The world says love should be self-serving.

<u>So let's do a quick little exercise here</u>: If you want to see how far short you fall, take out the word *love* and put your own name in its place. How true are the statements now? (Trust me, I did not fare any better than you will.) However, if you put the name Jesus in place of love - it fits perfectly.

Listen, the kind of love God wants us to give others is impossible to bring about or manufacture on our own. You might say (as we so often like to discuss on Sunday mornings) that it is a "supernatural" love. It is a natural outflowing of God's presence in our lives. And this is exactly why the Bible says to us, "God has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with His love" (Romans 5:5). If your love for others ever falls short of God's ideal, ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen you in this area. Your relationships will never be the same!

And so, let us always remember this: It's **HIS LOVE** that will hold us and never fail us. It's **HIS LOVE** that promises to pull us through.
