PASTOR'S CORNER: "ONE STEP AT A TIME"



James 2:2-4

"My brothers and

sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind, consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing."

Anyone who has ventured beyond their own

neighborhoods, or who has watched the news, has seen how widespread the devastation from Hurricane Florence is. The southeastern part of the state will be cleaning up and rebuilding for months and years. Homes have been totaled. Businesses have been lost. And the stress of the cleanup is so overwhelming that it can easily drive us to depression.

What I hope that this article is not, is yet another cliché telling you how God is in control. God is, but let us not make the mistake of believing that God is the *author* of our suffering. What needs to be said is that we *need God* to come to our aid. The truth is, we're victims of this storm. We not only need God, but we are in need of God's people. We *need* outside assistance.

There is someone reading this that may need to hear that it's okay to ask for help. That's our task as Christians, to work together – to serve, but also, we must ensure that we do not rob our neighbor the opportunity to serve us. There is a long road to recovery ahead of us. But may the road ahead not overwhelm us. The best we can do is take one step at a time. If we keep walking, we will get there – remembering all the while that our God is walking with us.

Let us also consider the poem "Footprints" whose authorship is unknown.

One night I dreamed a dream.

As I was walking along the beach with my Lord. Across the dark sky flashed scenes from my life. For each scene, I noticed two sets of footprints in the sand,

One belonging to me and one to my Lord.

After the last scene of my life flashed before me, I looked back at the footprints in the sand. I noticed that at many times along the path of my life, especially at the very lowest and saddest times, there was only one set of footprints.

This really troubled me, so I asked the Lord about it. "Lord, you said once I decided to follow you, You'd walk with me all the way. But I noticed that during the saddest and most troublesome times of my life, there was only one set of footprints. I don't understand why, when I needed You the most, You would leave me."

He whispered, "My precious child, I love you and will never leave you Never, ever, during your trials and testings. When you saw only one set of footprints, It was then that I carried you."


