May God help and bless those who were nominated by their fellow church members and who are willing to serve, if elected, this year. Please pray for each and everyone as he or she fulfills the tasks to which God has called him or her in the work of His Kingdom . . . in Jesus' Name and amazing love and grace! THANK YOU to **all** who are willing to serve in any capacity!

And . . . speaking of servants, those women and men who serve in public arenas are to be commended especially, and they all need to be assured and reassured of our special love, appreciation, and prayers for them and the many tasks they fulfill

and the dangers they face each and every day.

On Sunday, September 13, 2020, we paused in our Morning Worship Service for a moment of silence and prayer in memory of those who gave their lives when America was attacked horrifically on September 11, 2001, in what has since then been known as, called, and referred to as "9-11!" The World Trade Center Towers in New York City crumbled as an airplane crashed into one and then the other of those two towers. When we pastored in New Jersey, we often were blessed to have Mission Tour Groups who came to help us share the Gospel in that vast region. We would take them to the top of the World Trade Center and/or the Empire State Building not only to sightsee, but for them also to join us in praying for New York and the entire world from the top of those high and massive buildings. So . . . when the towers crumbled and fell, I saw more than just "financial center" towers falling, I saw "prayer towers" being destroyed as well.

On that historic and monumental day, an airplane also struck The Pentagon and a plane crashed into a field in Pennsylvania. Lives were lost in the buildings . . . in the planes . . . on the ground . . . and even many of the first responders sacrificed their lives as they tried to rescue and save others who were trapped, injured, or wounded. May we **never** forget those whose lives were taken that day as four hijacked planes were used to destroy lives! Let us also remember as well, all who labor daily to help all of us! Lest we forget . . . may we always pray for those servants and be thankful for them and the sacrifices they make each and every day for our safety and well-being in their line of duty.

Joy and I received the following writing entitled **Bulletproof Vest**, from a friend who serves as a police officer in Myrtle Beach. His words touched our hearts and they poignantly remind us of how we **all** need to "pray for one another," as James reminds us in chapter 5, verse 16, as we realize especially the tremendous need our public servants have for prayer and protection. I had the privilege of being the pastor of this fine young man, his wife, and both of their families. Please join me in prayer for **ALL** who serve and who try to protect and keep us safe... as we also pray for protection and peace for the entire hurting world! Thank you! His name is Rhett and he wrote:

Bulletproof Vest

Today as I prepared for another 12-hour shift of protecting complete strangers, I began tying my shoes. With my eyes focused on my laces, I saw the little bare feet of my oldest son walk up beside me. As I looked up to talk with him, I saw that he had put my bulletproof vest over his shoulders. Looking at his little frame being swallowed by my vest, he said, "Daddy, this thing is heavy."

As those words left his mouth, my heart got heavy and a lump formed in my throat thinking about all the weight that vest carries. He then ran off showing his siblings and friend saying, "Look! I'm a policeman, too!"

With time winding down, I had to finish getting dressed to insure a timely response to briefing. I asked him to come to me so I could finish getting dressed. He quickly ran over and stood like a soldier in front of me. His big blue eyes looked into mine with such innocence. As I lifted the vest over his head, he simply said, "I wanna be like you daddy... I wanna help people and catch the bad guys." As he said those words to me, I had to lower my head so he wouldn't see as my eyes filled with tears.

Just moments before, I had been made aware of my fellow brother and sister in LA (Los Angeles, California) who had been shot down by a coward while they sat in their patrol car. I continued my routine and slid the vest over my head. As I secured each strap, I sent up a little prayer. "Please return me home to him and please change his mind."

A bulletproof vest . . . a weight of 5-6 pounds, but it carries the weight of the world.

As we begin a new church year officially during this month of October, may we **all** commit to "pray for one another!" We **all** have roles of ministry! It may be within our families, in the larger community, within the church as a staff member or a church member, a deacon, a committee member, a teacher or leader, a member of the choir . . . an accompanist . . . an audio-visual technician . . . or a nursery worker. May we realize, celebrate, and thank God that we **ALL** have the blessed privilege and responsibility of being **SERVANTS** of God, our Heavenly Father . . Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord . . . and the Holy Spirit, our Comforter and Guide . . . TOGETHER . . . whatever our individual gifts and talents may be! Let's thank God as we celebrate and serve Him joyfully . . . individually and together . . . during this new church year and always!
