PASTOR'S CORNER



"After breakfast Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you." "Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him. Jesus repeated the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?" "Yes, Lord," Peter said, "you know I love you." "Then take care of my sheep," Jesus said. A third time He asked him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt that Jesus asked the question a third time. He said, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love You." Jesus said, "Then feed my sheep."

John 21: 15-17

Happy October church family! The Autumn skies are crisp and clear and the air is so fresh! And just to think: The season of holy Advent will be right around the corner. My how time moves fast. But we won't rush it one thing at a time, right? Pertaining to the scripture above, Peter knew that he had let Jesus down when he denied Him three times - this, just before the Crucifixion. But Peter also knew that Jesus had already forgiven him. Jesus tested Peter by asking him three times that probing, searching question, *"Do you love me?"*

Now, in the original language of this text, Peter's response to Jesus' questions has great significance. When Jesus posed the questions, he basically asked, *"Peter, do you love me with a sacrificial, <u>fully-committed kind</u> of love?" But Jesus must have detected that Peter first responded with a different word for love: Peter essentially said, <i>"Lord, I like you. I love you as a friend."*

At least Peter was being honest. He told Jesus the truth about his commitment. But as we all know, God is not interested in our scraps or leftovers. In the long run, He has little use for our 'part-time when we feel like it' attitudes. But nonetheless - NOW WATCH THIS - out of HIS OWN unsurpassed love, Jesus **still chose** to enlist Peter into his service! So as this story implies, we must love God before we can serve Him faithfully. <u>Here are five ways to tell if we really love God</u>:

- 1. WE LONG FOR PERSONAL COMMUNION WITH HIM. Can you relate to the words of the Psalmist, "As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you, O, God." (Psalm 42: 1)? When we really love God, we delight in praising and worshiping Him and enjoy spending time with Him and his people.
- 2. WE LOVE THE THINGS HE LOVES. We know what God loves by what he has declared in his Word, the Bible. So if we love God, we will also love His Word. Bible study will not be a drudgery but a delight.
- **3.** WE HATE WHAT HE HATES. As the Lord's nature becomes our nature, His likes and dislikes become our likes and dislikes. In fact, His outlook becomes our outlook. We know from His Word that He hates sin. If we love Him, then we should also hate sin.
- 4. WE LONG FOR HIS RETURN. Jesus described Himself as a groom. (Mark 2:19). His bride is the church the body of believers (Ephesians 5:23-29). When Jesus returns, He will be united with His bride. If we love the Lord, we long for His return as a bride longs for her groom.
- 5. WE KEEP HIS COMMANDMENTS. Jesus says, "If you love me, obey my commandments." (John 14:15). Though it is impossible for any of us who love God to go on an endless course of sin, we will still occasionally fall into individual sins. But if we love God, we will repent of those sins and seek His forgiveness. And our lifestyle will immediately conform to the truths we find in His Word.

We were created to glorify God, so we should purpose to serve Him with our Time, our Talents, and our Treasures.

HOLINESS MATTERS

Holiness matters. According to God's word, Christians are to conform to the image of Christ, Romans 12:2 NLT, *Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and <i>perfect.* So the way we live our lives as Christians is very important. If the world around us can't see that Christ is changing our lives, why would they want what we have? Why would they feel like they even need a relationship with God?

If we claim to be Christians, another responsibility we have is telling others about Christ and what He has done for us and for them. We must realize that there are people who need the Lord and don't even know it. In his book, *Share Jesus Without Fear*, William Fay says of himself, "Somehow I believed I wasn't that bad, that I was in the "middle" and therefore deserved to go to heaven. That was a lie. The Bible states that either God is your father or Satan is your father. Either you are in a relationship with Christ, or you're not; either you are born again, or you're not." It is our job to share the gospel with the people we come into contact with. Here's the simple plan of salvation that we can all share with the lost. We know that:

1. **"All have sinned"** - Romans 3:23—"For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard."

2. **"The wages of sin is death"** - Romans 6:23—"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord."

3. **"All must be born again"** - John 3:3— "Jesus replied, 'I tell you the truth, unless you are born again, you cannot see the Kingdom of God.'"

4. **"Jesus is the way"** - John 14:6— "Jesus saith unto him, 'I am the way, the truth, the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.'"

5. **"We must confess"** - Romans 10:9-11— "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved. As the Scriptures tell us, 'Anyone who trusts in Him will never be disgraced.'"

6. **"We must no longer live for ourselves"** - 2 Corinthians 5:15— "He died for everyone so that those who receive His new life will no longer live for themselves. Instead, they will live for Christ, who died and was raised for them."

7. "Jesus is standing at the door" - Revelation 3:20— "Look! I stand at the door and knock. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in, and we will share a meal together as friends."

If they realize they are a sinner and believe that Christ died for them so they can have a relationship with God, they may be ready to pray a sinner's prayer asking God to save them. That might sound something like this: "Heavenly Father, I have sinned against you. I want to repent for my sins and get forgiveness for them. I believe Jesus died on the cross for me and rose again. I turn from my sins and invite you into my heart and my life. I ask this in Jesus' name. Amen."

If in your witnessing, you have someone that does ask Christ into their heart and life, encourage them to share that with a pastor and their friends and family. If they don't have a pastor, we would love to have them visit with us at First Baptist.

We want to encourage you in your walk with Christ and be a part of the growth process. How we live our lives outside of this church matters because the world is always watching and so many people around us need Christ. **Holiness matters**!
