PASTOR'S CORNER:



We are Baptists. But what exactly does that mean? A few Wednesday nights ago, we had a conversation regarding that very question. And it's always good for us to be reminded of those beliefs that make a Baptist a Baptist, outside of the idea

that "My parents were Baptists, so therefore, I'm a Baptist." ⁽²⁾

There are essentially four beliefs that are central to Baptist polity:

- Priesthood of the Believers every individual has the capacity (and freedom) to pray, read the Bible and interpret it, and to know and understand Jesus Christ (we do not need a human mediator to approach Christ for us – i.e. priest, pastor, deacon, etc.). The priesthood of the believers is the cornerstone belief that all other beliefs stand upon.
- <u>Autonomy of the Local Church</u> each church has the freedom, the authority, and the responsibility to govern itself (there is no "higher church" lording a "right way" or "right interpretation" over the local church).

"BEING BAPTIST"

- <u>Believer's Baptism</u> it is the freedom of the individual to choose to follow Christ. We protect that choice by ensuring that we are not unfairly coercing or forcing any person into that choice. Therefore, historically, we have not practiced infant baptism because no infant could choose Christ by their own volition.
- Religious Liberty and Separation of Church &
 - <u>State</u> No government should ever impose upon the freedom of the individual to worship God by whatever means they feel led, however Christian that government may claim to be. Baptists' beliefs have shaped even the American Constitution. Baptists have historically stood for the freedom for *all religions*, not merely the freedom of *all Christians*.

We are Baptists because we find responsibility in protecting the freedoms that have been granted to us by Christ. "For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." Galatians 5:1

Wherever there is freedom, there should also be a great responsibility. We have all been called by Christ. I hope each one of us will find great joy in answering that call. After all, we are a priesthood of believers!

DID YOU KNOW?

Have you ever pondered the theological significance between the two different methods that our church uses to administer the Lord's Supper?

During Intinction, usually observed once a year in our congregation during the Christmas Eve Service, each member walks to the front of the church, takes the body/bread, and dips it into the blood/juice and then consumes.

Our other form of communion is when our Deacons deliver the elements to the congregation where they are seated, row by row. First, they serve the body/bread, then return the tray to the front. Then they serve the blood/juice and then return the tray to the front. We practice this method of administering communion three times a year.

Why do we practice both methods? Why not choose one and stick with it? The answer can be found when we reflect upon the theological implications of each method.

During Intinction, there is an act of personal volition that is not as prevalent in the other method. If we take seriously the concept of the priesthood of the believer, then this act of volition is important to the practice of the Lord's Supper. Each member is responsible for leaving their seat and moving toward the elements. As Baptists, this should make sense, as we place a high value on the individual freedom and choice that goes into our discipleship.

On the other hand, there is a strong theological significance of the Deacon body acting as the servant leaders of the congregation. When they serve the elements, they are modeling what it means to act as *servants* to one another.

Next time we come to the Lord's table, we can reflect upon the theological reasons for why we do what we do, and perhaps it will give us a greater appreciation for the different methods for administering the Lord's Supper.
