## PASTOR'S CORNER



I recently preached on the story in the Bible of the little boy (John 6:1-14) who shared his small and simple lunch of five (5) barley loaves and two (2) fish with Jesus. Jesus used the lad's unselfish act of sharing his lunch and He blessed many lives through the child's act of obedience and generosity.

You may remember that I used the phrases, *Little is much . . . when God is in it!* and *Little things mean a lot!* God can inspire and use us individually and collectively--in dramatic and often in unpredictable ways--"to tell the old, old story of Jesus and His love!" When I reflect

on the two quotes above, and as we begin a new school year--whether in person, or through home-schooling, or with virtual teaching and learning—I am reminded of just how important our teachers are in our lives and in the lives of all students everywhere. Lessons we are learning or have learned from those who teach or have taught us are invaluable. The following quote was directed at a fellow student and classmate who seemed to be in trouble often for talking when he should be listening! Mrs. Thelma Goforth, who taught us seventh-grade math and science at Blacksburg (SC) High School, would call him by his name and say:

#### The Wise Old Owl

The wise old owl sat in the oak.

The more he saw, the less he spoke.

The less he spoke, the more he heard.

Why can't you be like that wise old bird?

Years later, I corresponded with Mrs. Goforth and requested a copy of that poem. She kindly sent it to me, and she also shared another one of her favorites, saying in her response to me that perhaps I could use it one day in the ministry. And . . . Mrs. Goforth was right! I certainly have used both poems through the years. I share the poem with you now--with some adaptations from the original—with deep gratitude for this special teacher—and to many others who blessed me along my life's journey with many "little things" they taught that God has used as "giant lessons" in my life . . . my mind . . . and my heart.

#### Isn't It Strange?

Isn't it strange how princes and kings, and clowns that caper in sawdust rings,
And ordinary people, like you and like me, are the builders of eternity?

To each is given a bag of tools, a shapeless mass,
A book of rules, for each to build ere life has flown:
A stumbling block or a stepping-stone. (R.L. Sharpe)

It is difficult to believe that another school year has begun--or will begin soon! Please enjoy YOUR journey—wherever you are at this point—whatever your age may be—and whatever you are pursuing! May you meet and be blessed with your own precious teachers in your life—like Mrs. Goforth—who will encourage you with many "little things" along life's way—like these simple poems—which you will find can be "great blessings" in your journey! And . . . if you ARE a teacher, please remember the impact you are having—or may have had on your students. You may never know or realize this side of heaven the impact of your life and your teaching, but your students know . . . and so does God! Please keep up the excellent work, good and faithful servant! (Matthew 25:23) May God guide and bless us all today and always—in ALL ways—as He helps us see the persons He places in our lives, really are magnificent opportunities He gives us to serve Him . . . and to help all the "somebodies" He allows us to meet along our precious journey of life! Have a great and blessed school year—everyone—and please remember: each and every day of life has a "lesson" for us!

# CHURCH BUDGET DISTRIBUTED

On **September 19**, during the morning worship service, the church budget will be distributed for your review. This budget will be open for discussion at the church conference on **Wednesday**, **September 22**. If you are unable to attend the service on the 19th to receive a copy of the budget, you may obtain a copy in the church office **Monday-Wednesday**, **September 20-22**. **Please note**, the budget vote is not held at this meeting, but will happen on **Sunday**, **September 26** during the worship service.

# DEACON ELECTIONS

Deacon elections will take place during worship on **Sunday, September 12.** According to the FBC Bylaws, revised January 27, 2021, voted/approved at church conference, we have changed how deacons are elected. This is the first year we will use the new process, so we are including the information concerning deacon election verbatim from the Bylaws, Section 5. Deacons, 3. Election -

#### 3. Election.

- a. The election for deacons shall be held on the second Sunday in September during the morning worship service. At that time, the membership of the church shall list five (5) names for deacons. Following the counting of the votes the moderator shall talk to each of them and determine their willingness to serve.
- b. To enhance and expedite the deacon election process, the Church for a three to four week period preceding the election of deacons will use the Church newsletter and announcements at appropriate worship services to emphasize the prayer, study, and obedience to God's will needed in the deacon election process. Church members are encouraged to prayerfully consider persons they wish to recommend for deacons and are encouraged to talk with those persons whose names they wish to submit to determine if those persons would serve as deacons.
- c. The election of deacons by absentee balloting shall be permitted by any member desiring to do so. Absentee ballots may be obtained from the Church office by such member, or by a designee of any member, at any time prior to the closing of the church office on the Friday preceding the day of the election of deacons. The Church ministry assistant shall keep a record of all absentee ballots issued.

Please spend significant time in prayer about whom you feel God would have serve as the spiritual leaders of our church. Also, please reach out to those folks whom you believe God is putting on your heart, and ask their permission prior to writing their names down to serve as deacon.

For anyone who knows they cannot attend worship service on **September 12** for Deacon Election, there will be confidential absentee ballots available in the church office from **Tuesday**, **September 7 - Friday**, **September 10.** All absentee ballots must be in by **12 noon** on **Friday the 10th.** The absentee ballots will be transferred to the Tally Committee on Sunday morning, September 12, so they can be included with the other ballots. Please note the following people are ineligible for your vote as they are currently serving on the deacon body or rotated off last year:
