PASTOR'S CORNER



"Besides, who would patch old clothing with new cloth? For the new patch would shrink and rip away from the old cloth, leaving an even bigger tear than before. And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. For the old skins would burst from the pressure, spilling the wine and ruining the skins."

Matthew 9: 16-17

God's holy book uses phrases like *guard your hearts* (**Proverbs 4:23**), *be vigilant and cautious* (**1 Peter 5:8**), and *be on the watch* (**Hebrews 12:15**) for a very good reason. We don't need to fear, but we should be aware because there are saboteurs who are working to shipwreck our

faith before we even leave the harbor.

It's through the power of the Holy Spirit that we can overcome any opposition, but in order to do so we must first know what that opposition is. Now don't get me wrong, I don't think that we should ever place our focus solely on our obstacles - our focus is always on Jesus - but our obstacles are still part of the question. For instance, gaining a victory means defeating an enemy; and moving into something new usually means moving out of something old, departing from something that's been keeping us down, or holding us back. And when we make a choice to do the good thing and actually begin doing it, this is when we overcome evil with what is good. Pretty straight forward, don't you think?

As a loving church body this is also when we noticeably develop good fruit. People all around us in our community will see it, they will feel it. The fact is, First Baptist Whiteville - in so many ways - isn't like ANY OTHER church out there. We are unique in the way that we worship, we stand alone in how we love one another, and we always put the *centrality* of Jesus before anything else. So fear not, because good days (VERY good days) remain ahead of us. However, it must be said that evil will still try to oppress and tempt us. No surprise here, we already know this. Perhaps this is why the apostle Paul felt it was important to include this phrase in **2 Corinthians 5:17:** ... *The old [previous moral and spiritual condition] has passed away.*

And nestled between two phrases that speak to us of hope for something new, Paul carefully reminds us that letting go of the old is an important part of the process. So here is the entire verse:

Therefore if any person is [ingrafted] in Christ [the Messiah] he is a new creation [a new creation altogether]; the old [previous moral and spiritual condition] has passed away. Behold, the fresh and new has come! **2 Corinthians 5:17**

Our old mind-sets, unhealthy relationships, lies of the devil, past hurts, defeated attitudes, and crippling habits? These are all obstacles within our discovery. And considering the fact that along the way mistakes will definitely be made, it is never too late to begin again. They are part of the "old" that Paul says has "passed away." The good news is that we no longer have to allow these hindrances of the past to affect our present or our future.

Our church is in the process of moving forward, not backwards. We will soon be approaching a brand new season where the selection of new deacons will be coming before us. Who will be called to serve? These are exciting times because First Baptist is on the move! **GOD BLESS YOU ALL. JESUS LOVES YOU!**

DEACON ELECTION

Deacon Election will take place during worship on **Sunday, September 14.** In order to allow ample time for prayer and the seeking of God's will in the election of our church deacons, we wanted to get the necessary information to you in this edition of the newsletter.

According to the FBC Bylaws, revised January 29, 2025, voted/approved at church conference, we have changed how deacons are elected. Since this voting process Bylaw change is still new, we are including the information concerning deacon election verbatim from the Bylaws, Section 5. Deacons, 3. Election -

3. Election.

- a. The election for deacons shall be held on the second Sunday in September during the morning worship service. At that time, the membership of the church shall list four (4) names for deacons. Following the counting of the votes the moderator shall talk to each of them and determine their willingness to serve.
- b. To enhance and expedite the deacon election process, the Church for a three to four week period preceding the election of deacons will use the Church newsletter and announcements at appropriate worship services to emphasize the prayer, study, and obedience to God's will needed in the deacon election process. Church members are encouraged to prayerfully consider persons they wish to recommend for deacons and are encouraged to talk with those persons whose names they wish to submit to determine if those persons would serve as deacons.
- c. The election of deacons by absentee balloting shall be permitted by any member desiring to do so. Absentee ballots may be obtained from the Church office by such member, or by a designee of any member, at any time prior to the closing of the church office on the Thursday preceding the day of the election of deacons. The Church ministry assistant shall keep a record of all absentee ballots issued.

Please spend significant time in prayer about whom you feel God would have serve as the spiritual leaders of our church. Also, please reach out to those folks whom you believe God is putting on your heart, and ask their permission prior to writing their names down to serve as deacon.

For anyone who knows they cannot attend worship service on **Sunday**, **September 14** for Deacon Election, there will be confidential absentee ballots available in the church office from **Monday**, **September 8** - **Thursday**, **September 11**. All absentee ballots must be in by **4:30 p.m. Thursday**, **September 11**. The absentee ballots will be transferred to the Tally Committee on Sunday morning, September 14, so they can be included with the other ballots. Please note the following people are ineligible for your vote as they are currently serving on the deacon body or rotated off last year:
